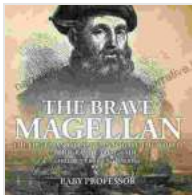


Ferdinand Magellan: The First Man to Circumnavigate the World

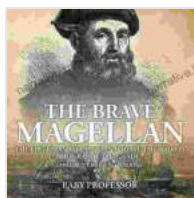
