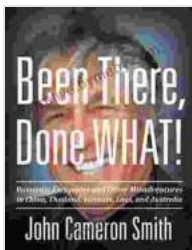


Romantic Escapades and Other Misadventures in China, Thailand, Vietnam, Laos, and Cambodia

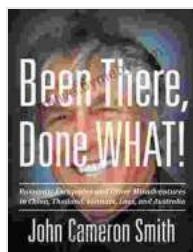
