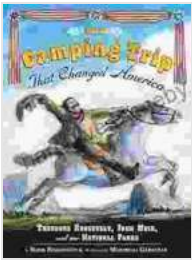


# The Camping Trip That Changed America

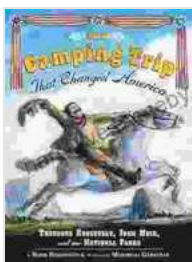
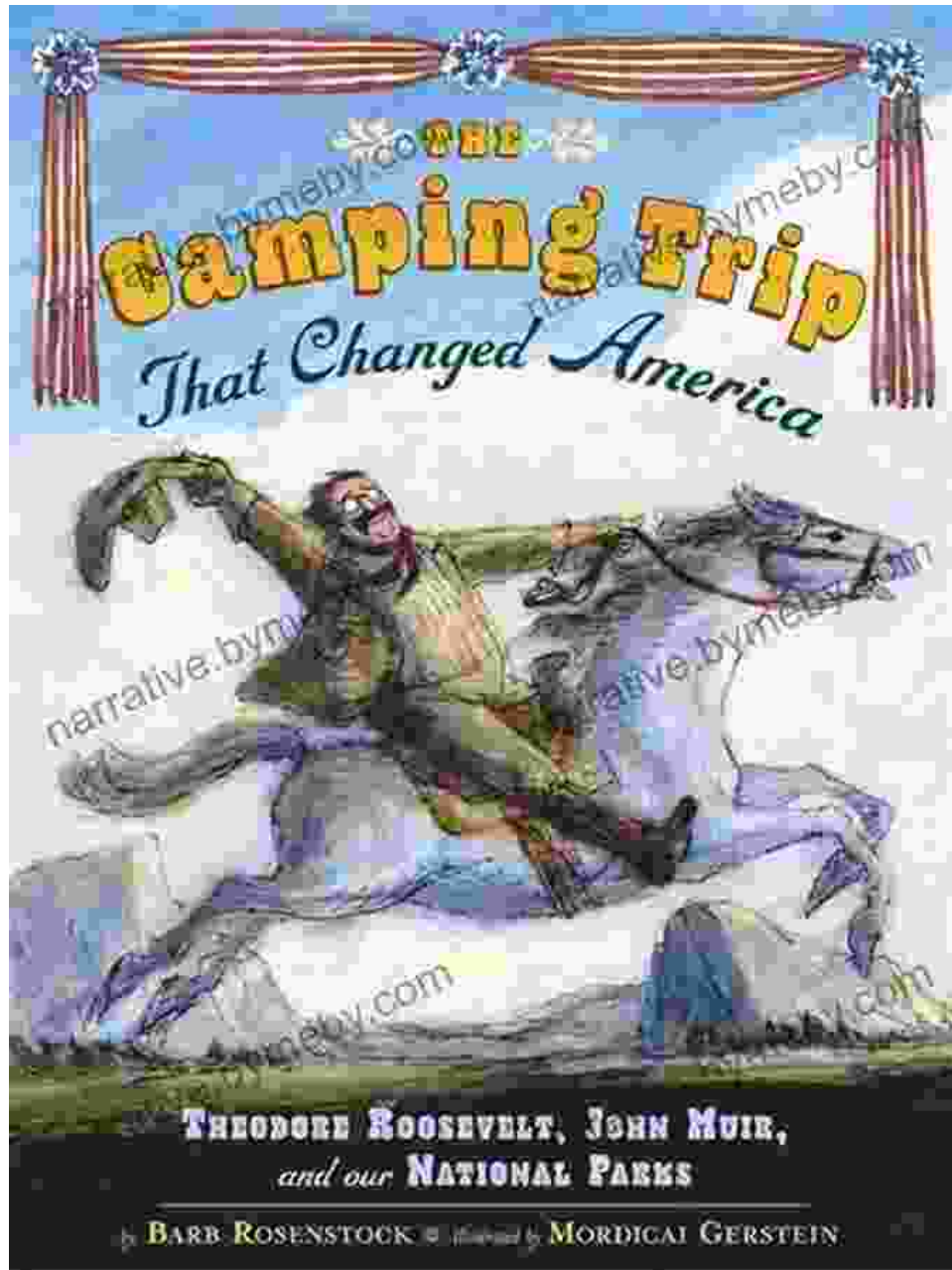

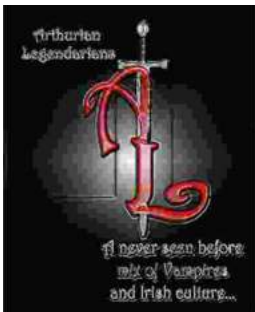
