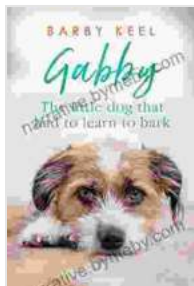
The mean dog stopped in its tracks and backed away. Buster was so relieved. He realized that even though he couldn't bark, Mrs. Johnson would always be there to protect him.

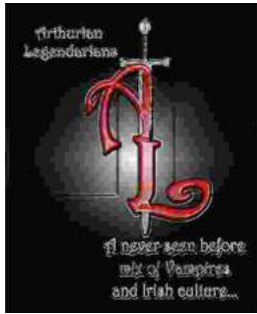
